Aleksander Kwasniewski

Poland that finally brought the peaceful transformation of Poland and the whole Central and Eastern Europe from communism to democracy. Once the Iron Curtain had fallen, he co-founded the Social Democratic Party of the Republic of Poland (SdRP) and became its first chairman.

Won the Polish presidential elections in December 1995, defeating incumbent Lech Walesa. One of Mr. Kwasniewski's first great achievements was to bring about a new democratic Constitution in Poland, which became effective in July 1997. Highly popular in his country, he was re-elected in 2000 for a second and final five-year term.


During his Presidency, he played a key role in the reconciliation

between the Poles and the German, the Jewish and the Ukrainian people. He further inspired the international mediation efforts during the 2004 Orange Revolution in Ukraine, helping the young democracy to prevail. Finally, he also was a strong advocate of EU and NATO integration, and made Poland join both institutions during his tenure.

He is a member of the Board of Trustees of the *International Crisis Group*, member of the *Atlantic Council of the United States*, member of the *Bilderberg Group*, Head of the Supervisory Board of the *Amicus Europae Foundation* in Warsaw, *International Center for Political Studies* in Kiev, Head of the *European Council on Tolerance and Reconciliation* and Head of the Board of *Yalta European Strategy*.

Studied Transport Economics and Foreign Trade at the University of Gdańsk. Joined the ruling communist Polish United Workers' Party (PZPR) in 1977, and remained member until it was dissolved in 1990. He was particularly active in the communist student movement, and worked as the editor-in-chief of the student weekly *ITD* magazine from 1981 until 1984, and of *Sztandar Młodych* from 1984 to 1985.

Participated in the famous "Round-Table" negotiations in



George Papandreou

served in several government posts, as undersecretary of Culture and Minister of Education, before becoming Foreign Minister from 1999-2004. Papandreou has received several honors for his commitment to promote peace and democracy, as well as for fighting racism, and notably for his successful campaign, as Foreign Minister, to engineer a rapprochement between Greece and Turkey.

An active supporter of the information society and e-democracy, in 2003 Papandreou was selected as one of the "25 People Who are Changing the World of Internet Politics". As President of the Panhellenic Socialist Movement (PASOK) from January 2004 - March 2012, Papandreou launched radical reforms of the Greek party political system.

He graduated from Amherst College and holds an M.Sc. in Sociology and Development from London School of Economics. An MP since 1981, he

Boris Tadić


After the overthrow of Slobodan Milosević's regime in 2000, Tadić served as the Minister of Telecommunications under the Democratic Opposition of Serbia coalition. From 2003 until 2004, Tadić served as the Minister of Defense to Serbia and Montenegro.

Zoran Đinđić in 2003 and was chosen as the new leader of the Serbia's Democratic Party in 2004, and later that year he won the general presidential elections.

Graduated from the Faculty of Philosophy at the University of Belgrade, studying Social Psychology. After graduating from the University of Belgrade, taught psychology and worked as a military clinical psychologist. In 1997, he founded the Centre for the Development of Democracy and Political Skills, an NGO specializing in political and civil education.

While serving as Minister of Defense, made dramatic reforms to the Ministry and the military, both of which displayed unique courage and leadership skills. He was responsible for creating a rapid reaction force under the control of civilians, and his reforms of the Ministry brought it to comply with NATO regulations. After the assassination of

As president of Serbia, led the movement for a "new Serbia", and revitalized Serbia's role internationally. Encouraged the development of business within Serbia, and promoted regional trade within the Balkans. In 2007, as a President made an official apology to Croatia for any crimes committed on Serbia's part during the war with Croatia in the early 1990's. His presidency brought Serbia closer to membership in the European Union.

For his involvement in the movement for equality of Croatia in the former Yugoslavia, known as 'Croatian Spring', was convicted and spent a year in prison (Stara Gradiska), in the early 70s. In the early 90s joins movement and later the party of Croatian Democratic Union (HDZ).

He obtained his Master's degree in 1977 with the thesis Concept of Nature and History in the works of Hegel and Marx. He gained his doctoral degree in June 1985 from the same faculty with the thesis Dialectics of Commodity Categories (Prerequisites of Dialectics of Discontinuity in Karl Marx's "Capital").

On the first democratic elections in Bosnia and Herzegovina in 1990, Ivo Komšić ran for Presidency of the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina as a candidate of the Socialist Democratic Party (SDP). At the beginning of aggression on the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina in 1992, he served temporarily at the Ministry of Defence as a volunteer. The siege of Sarajevo

found him in Kiseljak, where he joined the humanitarian organization "Caritas". Shortly before the escalation of war in Central Bosnia, on April 12, 1993, he founded the Croatian Peasant Party with a group of Croat intellectuals in Sarajevo, which was under siege at the time, and became its president. This party created an alternative Croat policy in Bosnia and Herzegovina, opting for preservation of unified Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina and coexistence of Croats with other nations in the whole of Bosnia and Herzegovina. This significantly contributed to the lessening of hostilities in the armed conflict between the Army of Bosnia and Herzegovina and Croatian Defence Council (HVO).

Was one of the organizers of General Assembly of BiH Croats, held on February 6th, 1994, and president of Croatian National Council. This Assembly adopted the peace plan which formed the basis of Washington Peace Agreement where-

by peace was established between Croats and Bosniacs in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Author of the new BiH Constitution based on federation of cantons, with precisely determined number of Cantons, their respective territories and numbers of inhabitants.

Participated in almost all BiH peace agreements. He is a renowned researcher and lecturer at the University of Sarajevo, and a very active figure in public and political life. From 2000 to 2002 he served as chairman of the House of Peoples at BiH Federal Parliament. From 2006 to 2008 he was a delegate at the Assembly of Sarajevo Canton and House of Peoples at the BiH Federal Parliament.

Author of four books, hundreds of science and expert articles presented at national and international scientific conferences and published in journals and special publications.
